This morning we welcome Stephanie Cooper to St Peter's Church. She is Regional Coordinator of North & East Yorkshire for Christian Aid and will be preaching at our 9:30 am and 11:00 am services.

All mums should live

Sierra Leone is the world's most dangerous place to become a mum. Every day 10 women die from giving birth. In the Sawula district, the community struggle with a clinic which has no electricity and only two delivery beds.

Jebbeh (*pictured below*) is heavily pregnant but as her baby grows, it's not joy that fills her heart, but fear. When Jebbeh's sister Fatmata went in to labour, there were so few ambulances that Fatmata had no choice but to walk for three hours under the baking sun, to the nearest hospital. The journey was long and with every step Fatmata struggled to keep going. Jebbeh told us: 'My sister was crying out with hunger. She died on the side of the road. She never gave birth.'

This Christian Aid Week, together, we can make childbirth safe for mums and babies. Through our gifts and prayers, we can help give the world's poorest mums a chance to live.

Christian Aid Week, is the 12th – 18th May, and if our Church raised £300, it could help provide a new delivery bed so more mums can deliver their babies safely. Please contact Judith Simpson (01423 564842) if you would like to volunteer to help with the collection.

- **Look at them** – face the person while you are speaking.
- **Speak clearly** – not too slowly and use normal lip movements, expressions and gestures.
- **Don't shout** – keep your voice down; it's uncomfortable for a hearing aid user if you shout.
