Every year St Peter's Church gives at least £3,000 in donations to different charities – half of these are local and half are working overseas. Find out more about these charities and the work that they do over the next few weeks in the Weekly News.

Artizan International (originally named *Craft Aid International*) was founded in 2013 by Susie Hart MBE. Susie started **Artizan International** on returning to Harrogate after 10 years of life

and work in Tanzania, where she set up a social enterprise called *Neema Crafts* that provides training and employment for people with disabilities, all of whom are now able to support themselves and their families with dignity and pride.

Susie set up the registered charity **Artizan International** to pass on this model to other developing countries where people with disabilities are still living in poverty. She also found that differently-able people in the UK are often very socially

isolated, so the charity started running weekly therapeutic crafts sessions for adults with disabilities in Harrogate and Leeds.

In **Peru**, there are now three projects: a therapeutic crafts workshop for a large group of people with learning disabilities run by local volunteers; a social enterprise providing training in jewellery making and textiles; and a therapeutic crafts workshop in a home run by the local Anglican Church. In **Ecuador** the charity runs a training and social enterprise, making paper from banana leaves and recycled paper. The beautiful paper and cards they make (*seen here*) are sold locally and through Fair Trade shops in the UK. Are you an Idler? A question from Zero Carbon Harrogate

Local air pollution is a major risk to human health and has been shown to cause or exacerbate a wide variety of illnesses ranging from itchy eyes, to eczema, lung disease and even cancer. It is a particular concern for children's health as it can stunt lung growth and affect lung capacity. Unfortunately, local air pollution is far worse in Britain's towns and cities than elsewhere in Europe.




Exhaust emissions caused by leaving a car engine running whilst stationary are among the most significant causes of local air pollution and this is especially worrisome outside

schools and hospitals as well as in town centres and near main roads.

Zero Carbon Harrogate, a group of local residents supporting the development of a low carbon sustainable economy in the District, is leading a local **No Idling** campaign to encourage motorists to switch off their engines when stationary to help reduce pollution and improve health. Other towns and cities up and down the country are embracing this same type of campaign. Volunteers are liaising with local schools and parents, with hospitals and members of the public in the District to spread the message that idling is *fuelish* (it wastes petrol) as well as being a hazard to health.
