Archbishops call for tolerance and respect

In their General Election message, Archbishops Justin Welby and Dr John Sentamu encourage people to play their part in the political process but also to uphold the Christian values of truth, humility and love.

"It is time to set aside apathy and cynicism and to be people of hope," they say. "We often forget that our



political leaders face huge responsibilities and challenges, and these come with personal sacrifices too. In our prayers for this election we should be thankful for those who put themselves forward for public service and ask that they will seek the common good and justice. We should take part, as important decisions are being made that will affect us all. That includes fulfilling our democratic duty to vote."
