Our Annual Meeting is this Tuesday evening

In May each year we gather: to review the past twelve months; to elect Churchwardens and new Parish Church Council (PCC) members; to hear reports and to ask questions; and to look to the year ahead.



The Annual Meeting this year will take place in Church on Tuesday 23rd May at 7:00 pm. Alongside the APCM booklet, the Annual Review provides an additional aid to reflection and celebration. At this year's meeting Sarah Martin (*left*) will be standing down as Churchwarden. The APCM will provide an opportunity to say thank you for Sarah's years of

service as Churchwarden, including during the particular challenges of the pandemic. I am delighted that Mo Atkinson has agreed to stand for election, alongside Sian Lockwood, for the coming year.

There remain spaces available for new members of the PCC, and we will also be electing Deanery Synod Representatives. A 'PCC Tonight' booklet outlining the purpose and remit of PCCs is available alongside the nomination sheets on the Welcome Desk. To stand for election as a Churchwarden or a member of the PCC, or Deanery Synod Representative, you must have been a member of the St Peter's Electoral Roll for at least the preceding six months.
