Help at Home - providing practical help around the home including odd jobs, decorating, DIY and gardening.




Training is provided and mileage reimbursed. Our volunteering roles can be done at times to suit you e.g. term time only, ad hoc, weekdays etc.

In the 1930s there was a lovely Japanese Garden by the boating lake in the Valley Gardens, but over the years it had become somewhat lost and forgotten. But, in the past two years, with the help of a Heritage Lottery grant and the expertise of the Japanese Garden Society, the Friends of the Valley Gardens have worked tirelessly to restore it to its former beauty. The Japanese Ambassador will be coming to garden officially open the Wednesday 17th October and unveil a boulder carved with its new name -Shijima no niwa or Garden of Serenity.

General Epistles part 1 – a Bible track seminar by The Right Revd Graham Tomlin

Fields of mud, seeds of hope



Wet earth from Passchendaele has been used by local artists to make an artwork to commemorate the centenary of the end of the First World War and will be on display at Ripon Cathedral until 14th November. As it dries out cracks will appear revealing five battle weary soldiers and deep within the piece are millions of poppy seeds to represent hope and the resilience of life. Pieces of the work will be planted in gardens afterwards, so the poppy flowers will one day bloom.
