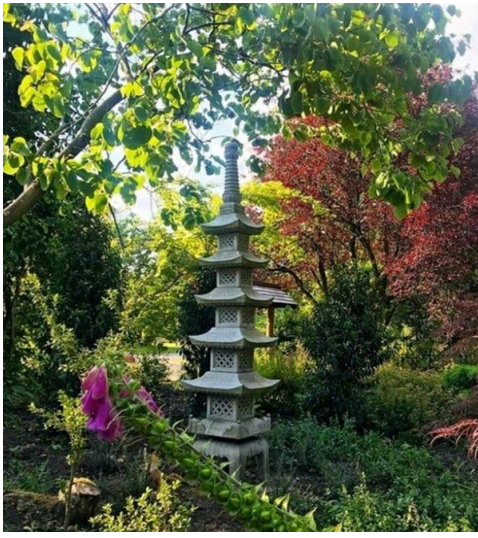
Your Call

Jen Bursell reminds us all to improve our e-mail safety

In a world where we are increasingly reliant on the internet, we have recently been reminded how vigilant we have to be in terms of our data and how secure it is.

Unfortunately my e-mail got hacked into (don't ask me how – I thought my password would have been hard to get hold of). The hackers sent out an e-mail which stated we were in the Ukraine and that I needed money after a mugging - this was sent to all my contacts. Then all my contacts and e-mails were deleted, so I had no way of seeing who had received it. I am so sorry if you did.

I have, of course, changed all my passwords and have deleted my old e-mail address. To try to make some good come from this I thought I'd share some of the ways I've been advised that can improve e-mail safety:

- make sure your e-mail password is very different from any other passwords you use,
- passwords need to contain numbers and letters (a 50/50 split is good),
- if an e-mail isn't addressed to you personally, or you think that something isn't right – contact the person/organisation by another means to double-check,
- contact *Action Fraud* (www.actionfraud.police.uk or 0300 123 2040) if you are concerned that a potential cyber crime or fraud has taken place,
- if you are concerned you might be at risk of identity fraud, place yourself on the *Cifas* list (www.cifas.org.uk or 0330 100 0180); it costs £20 for two years and they alert organisations if an individual applies for something in your name.

Once again sorry to those who it affected, and thank you to all of you who showed concern – it has been the good in a bad situation.

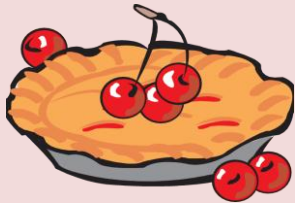

Green Your Life eco tip of the week

October – keeping warm

Stop the draughts! Professional draught-proofing of windows and doors, and blocking cracks in floors and skirting boards can save around £25 a year on energy bills. DIY draught-proofing can be much cheaper. Installing a chimney balloon could save around £15 a year as well.
