

Young People's Confirmation 2019



In 2019, preparation for Baptism/Confirmation for young people (Year 7 and above) will take place on Sunday evenings from 6:00 -7:00pm here at St Peter's – starting on Sunday 13th January and running through till the end of March. The Confirmation Service itself will take place at St Peter's on Sunday 9th June 2019 at 6:30pm.

This year's preparation will use **Youth Alpha**. This is a brand new interactive series of thirteen short episodes designed to help engage young people in conversations about faith, life and God. The series features stories from all around the globe, from a wide variety of different contexts and cultures. Each episode is interactive—with short breaks that make space for discussion in small groups.

In each session we will include food, a short video and discussions in small groups. Young people who are already confirmed, and those who would just like to explore the Christian faith without necessarily seeking Confirmation, are also welcome to join in.


