
Meeting with more mature Christians and doing a structured Bible study began to fill in the gaps

and get me answers to my doubts, fears and misconceptions about Christianity. As I got to know the Group as individuals I started to feel 'safe' enough to ask even the silliest questions about Christianity and to share personal things about my own my life. We were regularly reminded by the Group leader that anything said within the meeting was to remain confidential. I felt secure enough to ask for personal prayers along with praying for others. This sense of freedom encourages people to share their Christian journey from which we can learn much and find great comfort. You may realise that a worrying situation you might be in is not unique and someone else has been there before and survived!

Another advantage of being part of a Home Group, is knowing each other so well that you feel supported when times get rough, as your Christian friends have a deep knowledge about you and your circumstances. Life does not always run smoothly and the power of prayerful and sometimes practical support at such times cannot be overstated.
