
Earlier this year, Christians from a range of different churches across Harrogate gathered at the Cedar Court Hotel for the first of what we hope will be an Annual Civic Prayer Breakfast. We invited six representatives from different aspects of town life to tell us about areas of their work where we could support them in prayer.

Steve Scarre, President of Harrogate and District Chamber of Commerce, spoke about **Business**; Lisa Winwood, the very recently appointed Chief Constable for North Yorkshire spoke about the **Police**, and Julia Collins, Headteacher at St Peter's Primary School, spoke about **Education**.

This was an excellent, and very well supported, event. It was a great opportunity to gain an insight into the challenges faced by some key individuals in our community, and, as Christians with a common purpose, to pray for them.


