

South Aisle Floor Repairs



Long-awaited repairs to the South Aisle floor begin on 7th January 2019 and are due to continue for five weeks. These repairs are necessary because beetledamage to supporting joists have made the floor unsafe. For the duration of the work the area outlined (*see diagram*) will be boarded out. The Old Baptistery and Bell Tower will still be accessible.

Church Closure Monday 7th and Tuesday 8th January 2019

Breakfast Club, Food Parcels, Morning and Evening Prayer will continue, but, otherwise, the Church will be closed to visitors on 7th and 8th January. The Healing Service will take place in the Choir Room. On Wednesday 9th January the Church will be open to visitors as normal. Thursday Communion will take place on Thursday 10th; Lunchtime Reflexions returns on Thursday 17th January.

Smell

During the repairs, wood will be treated with a chemical which has an unpleasant but non-toxic smell. Notice will be given when this process will take place.

Floor Covering

Once the floor is repaired a replacement, hardwearing grey carpet will be laid across the whole of the front of the nave. Notice of dates affected will be given nearer the time.

Parking

We will have access to only one parking space in the alley for the duration of the works. It is important that no one uses this space without prior arrangement with Carole Raw, Parish Administrator.

We are grateful to the trusts and individuals who have generously provided the funds for this essential work. Your understanding during the inevitable disruption will also be much appreciated.

Sunday Lunch Club Meets Today!


