

There is nothing more refreshing than learning a new skill or discovering a new idea. The world is a wonderful place, full of extraordinary possibilities and unanswered questions. Venturing into the unfamiliar can recharge us with wonder and remind us of the riches of God's grace.

These days we have some great opportunities for learning right on our doorstep. If there is something about Christian faith, practice or service about which you would like to know more, then you are very likely to find something of interest via the recently launched Diocese of Leeds learning portal: *learning.leeds.anglican.org*

Another superb local resource is the Harrogate School of Theology and Mission. HST&M has, in the past, featured some exceptionally fine speakers. On Saturday 12th January, there is a chance to hear one of the most internationally influential renowned theologians of our Professor Tom Wright times. extraordinary been an servant of the Church over the past forty-plus years publishing more than 80 books - ranging



from game-changing academic tomes to slim paperbacks for the person in the street. In this live lecture, 'Space, time and history: Jesus and the challenge of God', he will consider how we can talk about God in our confused Western culture. If you are interested in the world of ideas, this is an opportunity not to be missed.

The session at St Mark's Church begins with breakfast at 9:30 am and runs through until noon. Tickets cost £8 (students £5) which includes breakfast and refreshments - to find out more visit: hstm.org.uk



Work will begin on the repairs to the South Aisle floor tomorrow and should take five weeks to complete. On Monday 7th and Tuesday 8th January the barriers will be erected to enclose the work area to make the Church a safe environment for staff, volunteers and visitors. Whilst this work is being undertaken it will be necessary to close the Church to visitors from 8:30am until 4:30pm. Breakfast Club, Morning Prayers and Evening Prayers will not be affected. On Wednesday 9th January the Church will be open again to visitors as normal.

Please note the contractors will require to park in the driveway at the side of Church. This will mean that for the duration of the work there will be only **one car space available** - please speak to Carole Raw, Parish Administrator.

Ripon City of Sanctuary is part of the national network of City of Sanctuary groups; we help to promote a culture of welcome for asylum-seekers and refugees both within our area and nationally.

Do you love to knit? We'd love to pass on your knitted teddy to a refugee child who has recently arrived in the Yorkshire region. There are free patterns available on our website, although you can, of course, use your own. We ask only three things:



- bears should be big enough for children to be able to have a good hug,
- please stitch features on no attachments that could work loose and present a risk to small children,
- there aren't huge numbers of refugee children in the area, so we'd rather each person made one really lovely bear, which took a bit of time, than 10 small bears made more quickly.
