Sian was acutely ill in the first two weeks of December and doctors have strongly recommended her to change her lifestyle to allow more time for rest. It has been agreed with the Bishop, therefore, that she must relinquish her responsibilities as Churchwarden with immediate effect.

This is a great loss to our Church - but there is no question that our upmost concern is to give Sian every chance of recovering her health and strength.

Patricia Stableford, Churchwarden Emeritus, has very generously offered to take on Sian's responsibilities until the APM when a new Churchwarden will be elected.

Sian will be in very much in our prayers as we venture into 2019.

Do you love to knit? We'd love to pass on your knitted teddy to a refugee child who has recently arrived in the Yorkshire region. There are free patterns available on our website, although you can, of course, use your own. We ask only three things:



- bears should be big enough for children to be able to have a good hug,
- please stitch features on – no attachments that could work loose and present a risk to small children,
- there aren't huge numbers of refugee children in the area, so we'd rather each person made one really lovely bear, which took a bit of time, than 10 small bears made more quickly.
