St Peter's School take part in Maths Teacher Exchange

St. Peter's Primary School has been directly involved with the Yorkshire Maths Hub England-China Exchange in order to learn more about the way maths is taught in Shanghai in China, the highest performing country for maths results.



Emily Crankshaw and Matt Davies, Assistant Maths Hub Lead, learn about the Maths Mastery teaching approach from their Chinese colleagues.

Mrs Crankshaw our specialist primary maths teacher at St. Peter's went out to Shanghai in November for two weeks and experienced the culture and education system there. She observed and taught the children too.

Chen Jiajun and Lu Yong, our Chinese maths teachers from Shanghai, returned in January and spent the last two weeks teaching maths at the Hub school in Scarborough. Mrs Crankshaw has worked closely with them to support schools and teachers across North Yorkshire and at St. Peter's to understand what Maths Mastery is and how it supports and deepens children's understanding of mathematical concepts. Many of our teachers from St. Peter's observed lessons and worked with the Maths Hub to unpick the teaching and learning that Chen and Lu demonstrated. It has been a fantastic exchange and as a school we have gained so much from it. We look forward to sharing what Maths Mastery looks like at St. Peter's at out parent/child workshops in February.

Could you co-ordinate St Peter's Christmas Tree Festival?




