What is the Parochial Church Council (PCC)?



The role of the PCC

In summary, the PCC exists to co-operate with the Incumbent in sharing leadership of the Parish so that we may all:

- play our part in God's mission and ministry in this place;
- steward our buildings for the furtherance of God's kingdom;
- contribute to the wider life of the Church of England;
- conduct ourselves in ways which fulfil best practice in safeguarding, finance, and employment.

Membership

PCC members are elected at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting which, this year, will be held on 29th April. Members are elected for three years. To be eligible you must be over 16, on the electoral roll, baptised, confirmed, a regular communicant and able to legally be a charity trustee.

Meetings

Our PCC meets six times a year, and has a standing committee to carry on routine business between meetings. The PCC secretary posts the agenda and minutes of meetings on the website and notice board before and after each meeting.

Could you join the PCC?

This year we will be looking to recruit new members of the Council. We are particularly in need of people to represent the needs of children, families and young people. We are also looking for people with experience in finance, inclusion and safeguarding. 


Come for lunch next Sunday

World Day of Prayer: a women led, global, ecumenical movement

Everything is ready and the invitation is for everyone - men, women and children of all ages to join this Day of Prayer. Women of Slovenia, one of the smallest and youngest countries in Europe, have prepared this year's service and they encourage us to reflect on the barriers they have faced since the end of the Second World War



when their country was a part of Yugoslavia, a Marxist socialist republic. They share the challenges they have met and the hopes they have for the future.

On Friday 1st March there will be a service starting at 2:00 pm at St Mark's Church on Leeds Road, attended by the Mayor of Harrogate, Bernard Bateman MBE and his wife Linda. An exhibition, *Homeless Not Faceless*, exploring the causes of homelessness for people in North Yorkshire through photographs, interviews and objects will be held at Ripon Cathedral from 28th February to 17th March. The exhibition features the stories and photographs of
