There will be some differences to the usual service as it will not be a communion service, but there are still strong connections to our traditional service. This offering is not a one-off show; but we hope it will be received as an authentic act of worship.

One of my own missions is to ensure our youth feel like this is their Church and that they can shape and develop our Church life. I feel we need to give them the tools and confidence to participate within our Church's worshiping life.

Our youth are the future leaders, workers, carers of St Peter's and we must continue to nourish and help


The Happiness Lab starts this week!

The Imposition of the Ashes

On Ash Wednesday, Roman Catholic, Anglican and some other churches hold special services at which worshippers are marked on the forehead with a cross of ashes. This service draws on the ancient Biblical traditions of covering one's head with ashes, wearing sackcloth and fasting as signs of repentance. As the minister makes the sign of the cross on each person's forehead these words are said:



Remember you are dust and unto dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ

Please come to the Communion Service with Imposition of the Ashes at 11:30 am on Ash Wednesday here at St Peter's as this season of Lent begins.
