Churches have long been places where men and women have offered the highest efforts of their creativity in joyful response to the wonder of our Creator God.




Over the next few months there are plans to engage in a substantial creative project here in St Peter's: the renewal of seasonal textiles. our This includes the altar frontals, pulpit falls, clergy stoles, collection bowl inserts, Bible tabs, and burses and veils that, by their changing colours, help mark the seasons of the Church year.

Susie Hart, well known to many through her work with *Craftaid International*, will be preparing designs for the Parochial Church Council (PCC), and thereafter the Diocesan Advisory Council (DAC), to consider. At this early stage, however, there is an opportunity, on Saturday 13th April 9:30 – 10:30 am at St Peter's, for anyone who is interested to ask questions, contribute ideas and learn more about the what, where, when, why and how much of the project.

Archbishop responds to the terrorist attacks in Christchurch

In the wake of the shooting in New Zealand, the Archbishop of Canterbury spoke at an interfaith gathering at Regent's Park Mosque in London:

Much of what I was going to say has already been said. The killings in New Zealand are monstrous. The response of New Zealand, all its people, with Muslims in the forefront, is beautiful and inspiring. What they say to each other we say to you. Those who attack Muslims in THIS country or elsewhere attack every human being. You are not 'the other',



you are us. Those who act out of hate for Muslims act out of hate for all here. Those who acted or supported the actions in New Zealand attack all of us.

Jesus taught his followers to be peacemakers, 'for they will be called children of God'. Making peace is an action, it doesn't just happen. It requires us to be curious, to listen, to move across differences of culture, ethnicity, religion and politics in love. Hate crimes against those who are different have no place before God. We stand together for you are us, and we are you, together in the hands of the creator and judge of every person. May God protect and strengthen you.


