Our Annual Meeting is this Monday evening

In April each year we gather: to review the past twelve months; to elect Churchwardens and new Parish Church Council (PCC) members; to hear reports and to ask questions; and to look to the year ahead. **The Annual Meeting will take place in church on Monday 29th April at 7.00pm.** Alongside the APCM booklet the *Annual Review* provides an additional aid to reflection and celebration.



In the course of the past year Sian Lockwood has had to stand down as Churchwarden due to ill health. The APCM will provide an opportunity to say thank you for Sian's years of service during a critical period in the life of St Peter's. In Sian's absence, Patricia Stableford has been serving as Acting Churchwarden alongside our continuing Churchwarden, Paul Medforth. I am really delighted that both Paul and Patricia have agreed to stand for reelection as Churchwarden for the coming year. There are currently six spaces available for new members of the PCC. A 'PCC Tonight' booklet outlining the purpose and remit of PCCs is available alongside the nomination sheets at the back of Church. A further insight into the work of our PCC may be gained




The Bible Course starts this week on Wednesday evening!
