

Feeding Hungry People: Worship

Worship is what we're here for. That's true in the sense that the purpose of a church is to offer worship to God, but it's also true in the sense that worship is the ultimate purpose of the human being. We were created for a relationship with God. And the most natural expression of that relationship, the most natural response to the nature of God, is worship. Worship is what we are called to ultimately; it is the one human activity that connects our present experience and our future hope.

So, as we seek be a church that responds to the deepest human hungers, the third hunger on which we are focussing is the hunger for God himself. As St Augustine of Hippo famously said, 'You have made us for yourself, and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in you.'



As we gather for worship today we have the opportunity to express that deepest hunger and to find it met – as people who belong to one body with one purpose: to worship of the one true God.



In the wake of the fire at Notre Dame in April, a proportion of the profits will go towards the restoration fund to rebuild the French Cathedral. There will be an open bar throughout the evening and even the chance to see the organist performing, projected alongside the silent black and white film.

Set against the backdrop of church spires, church bells and a medieval skyline, Victor Hugo's story of Quasimodo and Esmeralda has captivated generations of

Hope of our calling – celebrating 25 years

More than a thousand women will be celebrating a Silver Jubilee this year - the 25th anniversary of their ordination to the priesthood in the Church of England. Bristol Cathedral led the way, with thirty-two deacons ordained priest on 12th March 1994; the following week three ordinations took place in Sheffield diocese; and then ordinations continued in other dioceses through April, May and June.

Among the first in this Diocese was the Revd Canon Wendy Welby, she was a curate here at St Peter's and was ordained Deacon in Ripon Cathedral in 1990 and Priest in 1994. Many of us attended her ordination service and it was wonderful. There was a powerful sense of being part of history and for us it was important to witness this momentous change to our Church.

Hope of our calling – a special service to mark the anniversary – will take place at Ripon Cathedral at 3:30 pm on Sunday 16^{th} June, when the Bishop of Ripon, the Rt Revd Dr Helen-Ann Hartley will be preaching.
