## St Peter's - gearing up to welcome the world

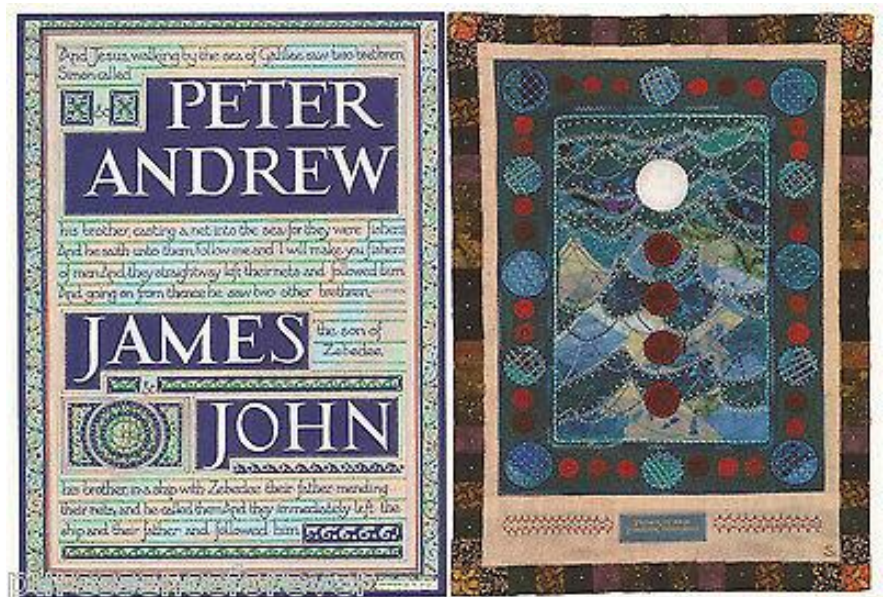


**HARROGATE

Millions of spectators from around the world are expected to throng to Yorkshire for the UCI World Cycling Championships on 21<sup>st</sup> – 29<sup>th</sup> September 2019. Harrogate will be epicentre

of the action and St Peter's is at the epicentre of Harrogate! This event, which will surely cause considerable disruption to our ordinary lives, is also a fantastic opportunity for St Peter's to offer a place of hospitality and Christian inspiration to the hundreds of thousands of guests passing our door each day.

To this end we plan to mount an exhibition of a part of 'One Man's Journey to Heaven – The Bath Abbey Diptychs' (pictured here – search online to see them in colour). The Diptychs are a portrayal of the life of Jesus in thirty-five pairs of panels – in calligraphy and needlework – with a selection to be loaned to St Peter's especially for the UCI event.



We would love to run a café alongside the exhibition each day of the races (except on the Sundays). This is, however, a major undertaking that will require several teams of dedicated volunteers. 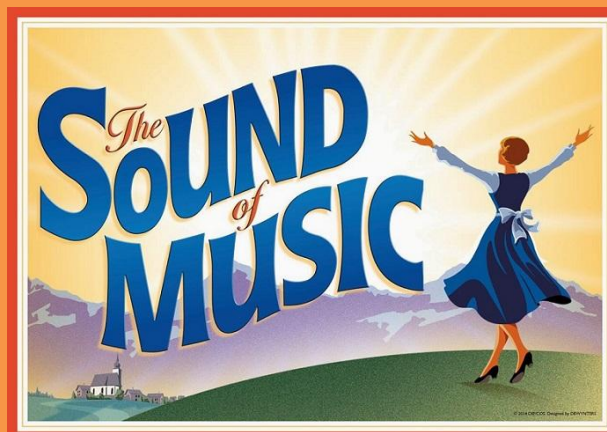



#### What is an Acoustic Neuroma?

An **acoustic neuroma** is a benign brain tumour in the canal from the ear to the brain


Their location affects **hearing** and **balance**

Related symptoms and effects that patients can suffer from include **single-sided deafness, tinnitus, vertigo & imbalance, headaches, facial weakness/palsy, fatigue, cognitive impairment and depression**

Due to their relative rarity, sufferers commonly feel **isolated** in their diagnosis, contributing to a general sense of **anxiety** and **fear** that living with the condition can create
