


St Peter's Evening Fellowship:

St Swithun's Day if Thou Dost Rain...

On Monday it is 15th July – St Swithun's Day. Legend has it that if it rains on St Swithun's Day then the wet weather will continue for 40 days:

St. Swithun's day if thou dost rain, For forty days it will remain,


St. Swithun's day if thou be fair,


For forty days 'twill rain nae mair.

St Swithun was the Bishop of Winchester in Saxon times. His dying wish was that he be buried in a simple grave outside his Cathedral; but in 971 the monks of Winchester decided to move his body to a more opulent shrine inside. The ceremony, on 15th July, was ruined by a huge downpour and so the legend grew up. Given the wet weather in May and June, let's hope Monday stays dry and fair!
