Every year St Peter's Church gives at least £3,000 in donations to different charities – half of these are local and half are working overseas. Find out more about these charities and the work that they do over the next few weeks in the Weekly News.

Time Together is a small, local charity, based in Starbeck, providing support and opportunities for individuals with Autism, Asperger's and additional needs. As well as individual support, they offer a range of inclusive social groups and activity clubs.



Happy Mondays is a social club for adults with learning or physical difficulties who meet for an evening meal and fun activities. On Tuesday mornings there's **FiIT TOGETHER**, a fun and fitness class, and in the evenings it's **Hub Club**, a small group for individuals on the Autism spectrum. Every Friday afternoon from 2:00 – 4:00 pm **Afternoon Tea** is served; it's free and open to all. There are two gaming clubs on Fridays – **Next Gen** for ages 16 and over and **Games Zone** for ages 8 to 18. For more information call 01423 883992.

The one to one support focuses on three main areas: independence; health and well being; and community. Life skills such as travelling on public transport, shopping and cooking healthy meals are taught in a practical way.

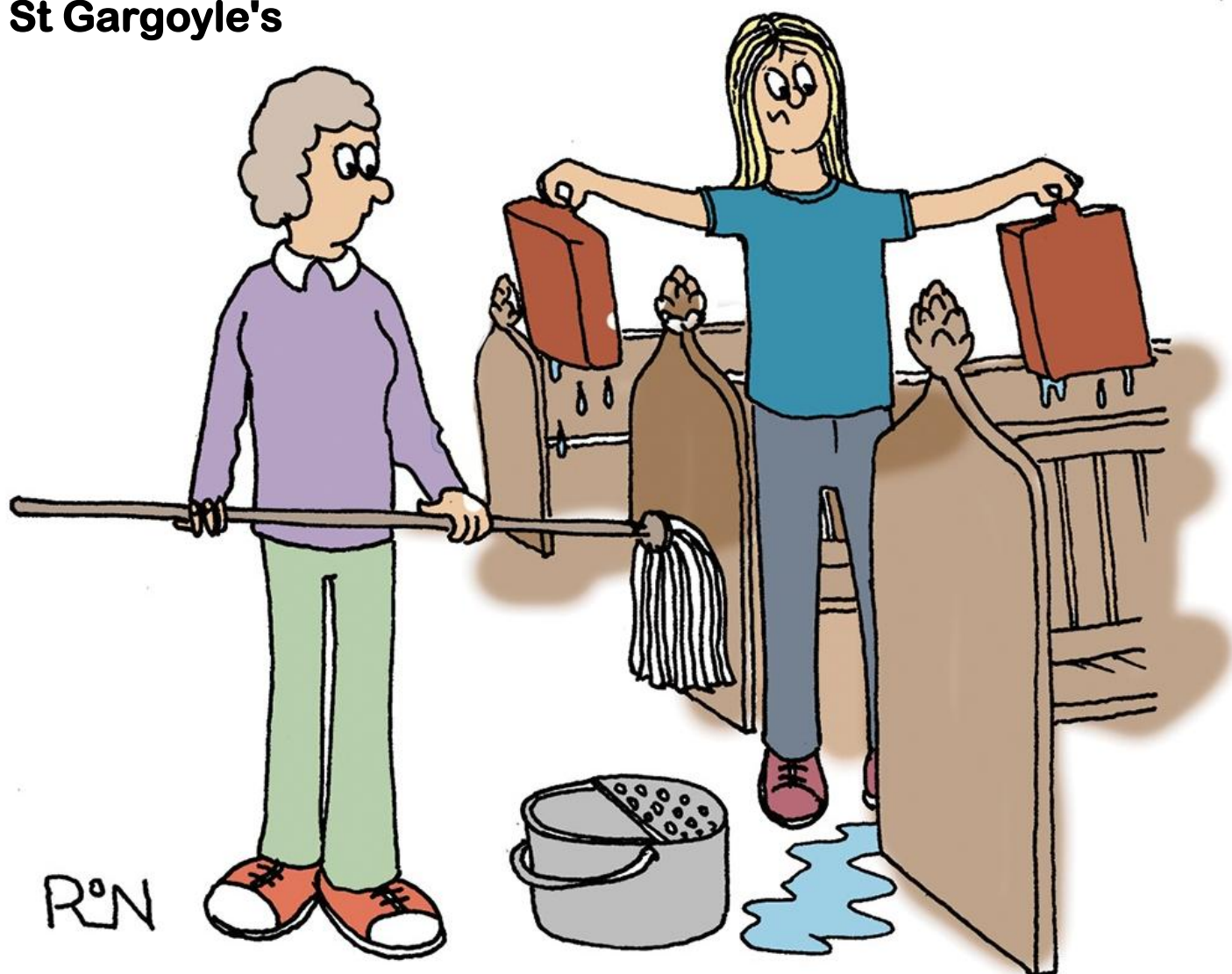


Ever wondered what theology means and how to study it?

The **Introduction to Theology** course, taking place at various venues, offers an opportunity to reflect upon the Christian faith and deepen your own personal journey. Topics covered include: understanding and approaches to the Bible; sources of theology; creeds of the Christian faith, introducing theological reflection; as well as study skills. Registration for this course at Mirfield and Bingley is open now, as they take place in Autumn 2019. The courses in Leeds and Ripon take place across 12 evenings starting in Spring and Summer 2020.
