Every year St Peter's Church gives at least £3,000 in donations to different charities – half of these are local and half are working overseas. Find out more about these charities and the work that they do over the next few weeks in the Weekly News.

Wellspring Therapy & Training was established in 2003 and last year moved into new premises in Starbeck. They provide affordable, psychological support to people in distress and promote good mental health through therapeutic work, education and training. Although Wellspring is a Christian organisation, they offer their services to everyone in need. St Peter's supports their work with young people in particular.



Wellspring runs an eight week **Empower course** for teenagers aged 14+ to explore, explain and improve their self esteem. The aim is to create a safe and confidential space so young people can talk about real stuff and experience the positive power of working in a small group. The next course starts on 26th September 2019 and

runs on Thursdays from 6:30 – 8:00 pm. To apply for a place phone 01423 881881 or email empower@wellspringtherapy.co.uk

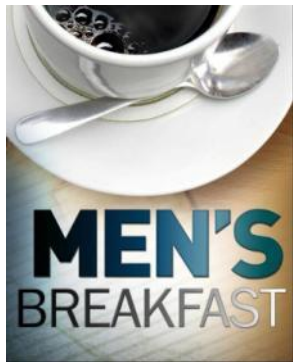
Wellspring also offers **counselling** for young people aged 8 – 18 years. A trained counsellor will help the young person understand the issues they face by encouraging them to talk about what is bothering them, listening carefully and prompting thoughtful exploration. They won't judge or criticise, but will offer support and encouragement to express difficult feelings and to make sense of their 'world'. This provides an opportunity to re-think things and make some positive changes.

Men's Breakfast at St Peter's Saturday 17th August 2019

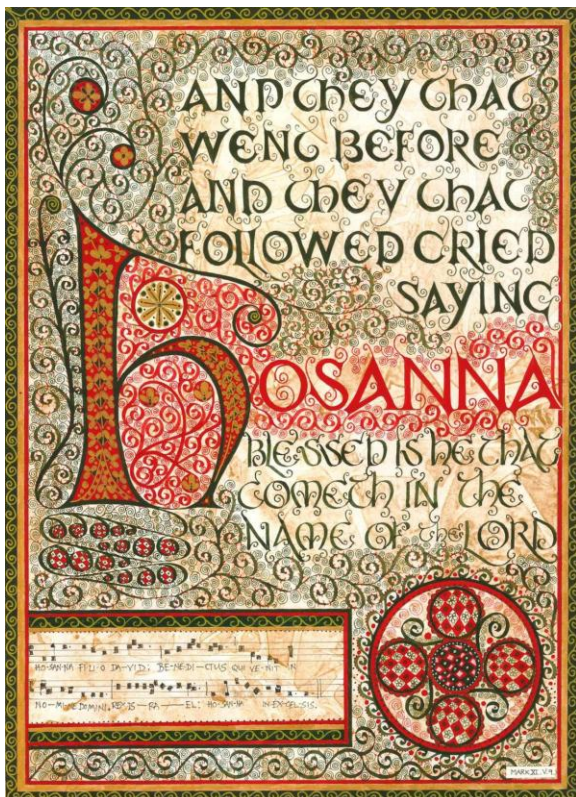

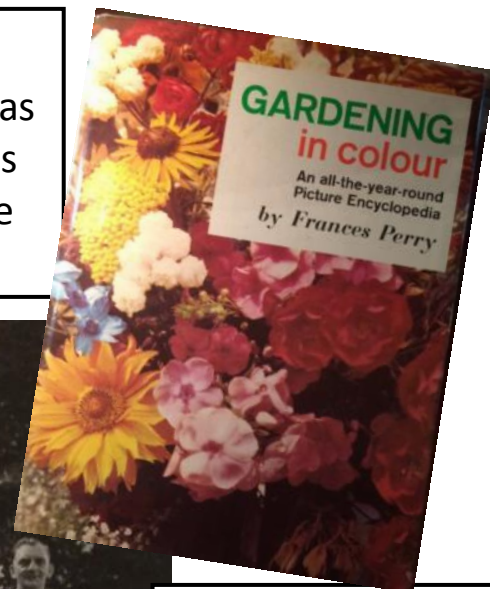
Volunteers Preview – The Bath Abbey Diptychs

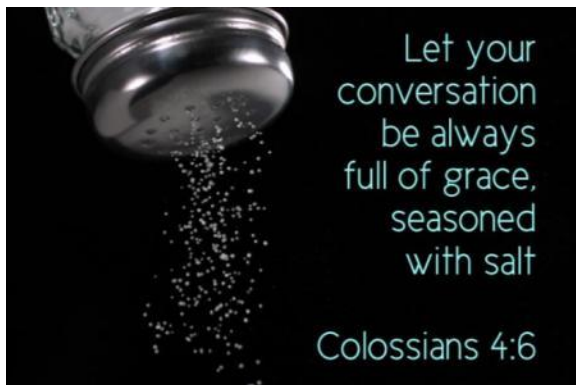
