Mission Possible (**)



Mission Possible UK (MPUK) is a Christian mission society seeking to serve the poor, marginalised and forgotten in Eastern Europe and in the Great Lakes Region of Africa. It was founded in 2007 by Richard Wallis (*left*), who last visited St Peter's with Rwandan Bishop Nathan Amooti in May 2016. The Bishop spoke of reconciliation and reconstruction in post genocide Rwanda and how, in partnership with MPUK, Star School was started.

Star School now teaches over 900 children in its nursery, primary and secondary departments. Since there is no public school system in Rwanda, families must pay for their child's education, but not all can afford to do so; in response **MPUK** set up

a sponsorship programme for children from poorest families to attend the School. Their most recent project is to build new walkways to link the buildings and new disabled toilets, making the School more accessible to children like Esther (pictured right). She joined the sponsorship programme in February 2019 and was struggling with crutches that were too short for her, but now she is so happy to come to School and have her own wheelchair.

St Peter's Church Library Good Reads – FINDING HOPE

We are hoping to provide more helpful information about the books on our shelves and to encourage everyone to find encouragement and inspiration in their faith through reading them. As part of this service, we will be recommending books on a chosen theme for short periods throughout the year and displaying them on the Library table for anyone to borrow.

For the next few weeks, we have selected three books for adults that all look at how people have found hope during difficult times:

1. Hope Stories presented by Dr John Sentamu, Archbishop of York (2014)

Encounter individuals whose lives have been transformed and those who brought hope to them in the 20 short inspiring accounts. Very different people in very different circumstances found hope during real adversity. Each short account is prefaced by encouraging words from the Archbishop.

2. When Faith Gets Shaken by Patrick Regan (2015)

As an enthusiastic and energetic leader of an outreach youth ministry in London, Patrick had faced and surmounted many difficult situations with bold faith, but when a serious injury requires long term and life changing treatment, his world comes crashing to a halt. This book relates his journey of re-engaging with the presence and promises of God in the midst of life's sufferings. A thought-provoking and helpful perspective to the questions of 'Where is God?' and 'Why is this happening?'

3. I am not my Father by Paul Scanlon (2007)

A short book of personal stories narrated by eight fathers. Each father offers an account of the journey towards an understanding of positive fatherhood despite the legacy of a father who failed them. The author writes:

'I am trying to reach out to the many men, young and old, in our communities who never had a father or at best, a poor one. It is about empowering the fathers of today to change their children's tomorrow.'

St Peter's Evening Fellowship: New Park and the Barber Line



Until the middle of the 19th century the New Park area of Harrogate was only partly developed. There was a coaching inn, the Little Wonder, named after a racehorse which won The Derby in 1840. But when the gasworks were built in 1847, houses were needed for the workers and eventually a school was built. Terry

Williams, a former teacher at that New Park School, will be the speaker at the next meeting of St Peter's Evening Fellowship on Thursday 5th September starting at 7:30 pm. Come and find out more about our local history.


Sunday Lunch Club Meets Today!
