
'Thank you' every volunteer

The heroic story of Father Hugh O'Flaherty

In Rome during the Second World War, a white line was painted along the streets near the Vatican on the orders of Oberstrumbannführer Herbert Kappler, the head of the Gestapo in Rome. It marked the point where the Holy See's authority ended and Nazi rule began. During the occupation Hugh O'Flaherty, an Irish priest working at the Vatican, outwitted Kappler and ran safehouses and an escape route for Allied servicemen and Jewish civilians – he helped over 6,500 people reach safety. He succeeded in evading capture and part of his story and his intriguing relationship with Kappler are told in the film *The Scarlet and the Black*, which will be shown at St Peter's Fellowship's Film Night on 3rd October **starting at 7:00 pm**.

Welcome, Inclusion, Respect

It has taken St Peter's some years to act upon a document from the Diocese of Leeds suggesting ways to ensure that our Church is truly open to all. Do we have *Open Hearts, Open Minds, an Open Church*? Well perhaps, but not always. Despite our best intentions some people, those with physical or mental health issues, may feel excluded and unwanted.



In March 2019 the PCC met to discuss a summary of the document and agreed three priorities - how to improve the physical body of the building, our means of communication and our overall approach and attitudes.

A small group was formed and three meetings have taken place. At the first we looked at positive evidence of inclusivity and then at areas that needed work; from there we highlighted those problem areas and they became our first priorities. We are investigating, among other things: how to improve our accessible WC; the design and placement of external signage; the sound system and the availability of large print for all of our written communication. Once a month an article, written by a member of our congregation, will be printed in the Weekly News helping, not just to raise awareness, but also to widen the debate.


