
Come for lunch next Sunday


Could you run a stall at St Peter's Christmas Fair?

Religious identity then and now 1569 – 2019



Marking the 450th Anniversary of the Rising of the North Markenfield Hall played a part in the Rising of the North in 1569, which attempted to stop the spread of the Protestant faith by deposing Elizabeth I and replacing her with the Catholic Mary, Queen of Scots. Sir Thomas de Markenfield was one of the main instigators of the plot and on 20th November 1569, a large contingent of rebels met at the Hall. They heard Mass in the Chapel before setting out on their ultimately fruitless quest. By January the rebellion had failed, and great numbers had been hanged as traitors in

Ripon Market Place where a plaque commemorates the events. *The Ripon Support Group of the Anglican Centre Rome* has arranged a day to mark this anniversary at Markenfield Hall and at Thorp Prebend in Ripon on Saturday 26th October. For more information contact Jenny Spruce at *jmhspr@aol.com*.
