Welcome, Inclusion, Respect for VIPs



You may well think that a VIP is a Very Important Person – well, they are, but in the world of the sight-impaired it means Visually Impaired Person. As with all people with limitations, VIPs come in all kinds of conditions from total blindness through short/long sight, reduction in the area which can be seen, to a constant wobbling (nystagmus). Each condition means the person has different requirements, but some general actions can meet a number of needs. Large print (not CAPITAL LETTERS!) is very helpful; colour contrasts are essential –

yellow or pale blue on white (and vice-versa) are hopeless; but clarity of print is also essential for those with focus problems. Also some conditions mean some people cannot see the screen, regardless of print size or colour.

At St. Peter's we do have the *Weekly News*, service sheets and hymn books in large print, but we need to make sure these are as readily accessible as the standard print versions and many notices round Church could be improved. Remember that a VIP may not obviously be a VIP! Improvements for VIPs can benefit everyone - colleagues at work were envious of my large-print email display!
