

Wanted: Wise Men (and Women)



How do you spot what really matters? How do you journey towards that goal without getting lost, or running into the sand on the way? The ability to see what's really important, and to live in the light of that insight, is essential to wisdom. Wisdom also has a lot to do with humility. 

Alpha starts here in January 2020



Wednesday is the new Friday #TryAlpha We believe that everyone should have the chance to explore the Christian faith, ask questions and share their point of view. **Alpha** is a series of sessions exploring the Christian faith. Each session looks at a different question around faith and is designed to create conversation. **Alpha** is run around the globe and everyone's welcome. It runs in cafés, churches, universities, homes - you name it. No two **Alphas** look the same, but generally they have three things in common: food, a talk and good conversation.

Alpha Harrogate is a group of local churches working together to deliver the best Alpha courses we can. We are holding an Alpha launch event at St Peter's on 23rd January from 7:45 to 9:30 pm (with refreshments from 7:00 pm). Come and join us as Adrian Holloway, a best-selling author and gifted communicator, takes on one of the big questions of our time 'Hasn't science buried God?'.

The next **Alpha** course at St Peter's Church starts on Wednesday 29th January 2020 from 6:00 – 8:00 pm, and runs for 10 weeks up until Easter. Each session will start

with a meal, because it's a great way to build community and get to know each other. Then there's a talk, around 30 minutes long, exploring the big issues around faith and unpacking the basics of Christianity. Followed by the most important part of any **Alpha**: the chance to share thoughts and ideas on the topic, and simply discuss it in a small group. Sarah Martin (*pictured right*) is our team leader.
