
Messiah at St. Peter's this Christmas

This coming Tuesday 17th December at 7:15 pm St. Peter's Church Choir, together with Vocalis (Harrogate's premier chamber choir), soloists Heather Jane Taylor, Lucy Morton, Toby Ward and Andrew Greenan are performing Handel's Messiah, supported by the professional Harrogate Handel Players with Alan Horsey (organ). Handel's Messiah has a unique place in the choral repertoire, vividly portraying the life of Jesus almost entirely through the words of Old Testament Prophecy.

Our performance in March 2018 was well received, one member of our audience writing to say that 'the evening was an absolute triumph...with excellent soloists...the

choir added much vitality inspired by the brisk but not uncomfortable tempi...this particular performance was refreshingly unique'. To our surprise and delight, we now find ourselves in a situation where it is not only possible but also desirable to fill a gap in the market by giving the piece again, because astonishingly there is no other performance of Messiah this Christmas in Harrogate this year. Thus we have the opportunity to welcome visitors to our Church through our music-making and we hope that our congregation will invite musically minded friends to share the experience.
