What's the point of resolving to make a new start in January? Isn't it usually the case that after just a few weeks, or even a few days, those good intentions have already come to nothing?

It might seem like that sometimes, but I believe there's more scope for optimism. Things might not always turn out exactly as we intend – in fact they almost never do – but it's surprising how often we can end up arriving at a place we aimed for by an unexpected route and, most often, on an unexpected timescale. If we fail to set such goals in the first place, however, we won't be alert to the surprising, usually totally unexpected, opportunities to step towards them. A test for this observation is to look back over the past twelve months or, better still, the past ten years. Where have you sensed God leading you over that time? What are the dreams he has persistently lodged at the back of your mind? What were the related things you repeatedly made resolutions about? It would be very surprising if the route has been straightforward, but it would also be surprising if you'd made no progress at all. So, it's always worth seeking God's agenda for what lies ahead, it's always worth keeping those higher goals in mind, and it's always worth resolving to take every opportunity to step towards them – even though we will, of course, repeatedly stumble and fall along the way.

## **Thinking about Confirmation?**

Each year at St Peter's we encourage people who want to be confirmed and publicly declare their faith, to attend a Confirmation course. We encourage adults to attend the Alpha course starting on Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> January 2020. For candidates who attend

secondary school, we will be adapting the book *Faith Confirmed* by Peter Jackson and Chris Wright. This course will be integrated into our youth group Sanctuary's Bible studies, runs during term time and is free to attend.

The first of the seven sessions will be on **Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> January** at 6:00 - 7:30 pm, meeting in the Brostoff Hall at St Peter's Church. The other dates of the course are:

#### Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> February - Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> March - Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> March Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> March - Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> April - Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> May

This course is designed to engage the participants in exploring the history of the Christian faith and how this faith is lived out today. Some of the topics that are covered are: *God - How and who do we believe in?*; *Prayer and Worship*; *Living as a Christian*. This confirmation course is essential to gain an insight into the Christian faith and will need to be attended if you wish to be confirmed by Bishop Helen-Ann at the Confirmation Service on **Sunday 7**<sup>th</sup> **June at 6.30pm**.



## St Peter's Afternoon Fellowship







Creator of the heavens, who led the Magi by a star to worship the Christ-child: guide and sustain us, that we may find our journey's end in Jesus Christ our Lord.


