



If you've been coming to St Peter's for any length of time you'll know what an extraordinary place of worship and service it is – as expressed in our Vision and Values. 
Mend: an art installation by Shaeron Caton Rose

The large-scale banner *Mend* has toured churches in the North of England, where it was offered as a focus for prayerful consideration. 


