



## Living Faithfully: Lent 2020

The resource guiding our thinking and teaching this Lent will be John Pritchard's *Living Faithfully.* John is a beautifully simple, but also profound, thinker and communicator. You may well have come across his writing already but, if not, I'm confident you will enjoy discovering what he has to offer.

*Living Faithfully* is a book about following Jesus in the every-day. It has twenty-one chapters about all kinds of aspects of life – from 'handling our sexuality' to 'facing death'. For the first five Sundays in Lent the Sermon will draw on the following five chapters:

8<sup>th</sup> March: Handling Money – Steve Jones
15<sup>th</sup> March: Working Faithfully – Stewart Davies
22<sup>nd</sup> March: Building Community – Chris Clayton

## 40acts challenges you to do Lent generously

**40acts** is the generosity challenge for Lent, created by UK Christian charity, *Stewardship*. For nine years, **40acts** has asked a question: what if Lent could be about more than just giving stuff up? What if it could be a time of generosity as well as spiritual discipline? Commit to the challenge at *40acts.org.uk*; then you will receive a daily email throughout Lent (not including Sundays!), with a generosity challenge (an 'act') and a short Bible-based blog sent straight to your inbox. Each act is designed to sharpen your awareness and give you practical ways to stretch your faith as well as your generosity using your time, energy, skills, resources or prayers.
