Worship and prayers on radio, television and telephone(?)

If you are unable to access the internet and cannot join in with our online worship then why not listen to a service on the radio (or even your telephone) or watch one on television?

Radio 4's Sunday morning service is broadcast at 8:10 am each week. Last Sunday it was a service exploring fatherhood and God as Father, with Ben Lindsay, Guvna B and Lord Michael Hastings. There was music from various artists including the London Community Gospel Choir. It lasts about 40 minutes.

Daily HOPE is a free phone line of hymns, reflections and prayers from the Church of England. Dial 0800 804 8044 anytime to listen to a message from Archbishop Justin Welby and then choose to listen to the Church of England's weekly service; the Hymn or Prayer Line; or to join in with traditional morning and evening prayers.


Songs of Praise comes from Northern Ireland this week

Songs of Praise is broadcast on Sundays at 1:15 pm on BBC One with a combination of hymns and songs together with uplifting stories of faith from around the UK. On Sunday 28th June presenter, Claire McCollum, shares her love of her home of Northern Ireland by looking back on some of the recent interviews she has done for the programme including one with a Christian geologist at the Giant's Causeway and another with a former professional footballer who was called to the priesthood. This programme lasts about 30 minutes.

Sunday Worship on BBC One


This is a series of Sunday morning services which were recorded before the closure of all church buildings was announced. They are broadcast on Sunday mornings at 10:45 am and have mainly been from Hereford or Bangor Cathedrals. However this week the service for Father's Day was from Holy Trinity Platt Church in Manchester led by the Rector, the Revd Dr Paul Mathole, with songs and hymns recorded by Songs of Praise in 2017. The programme usually lasts about 30 minutes.

If you do have access to the internet, both Songs of Praise and Sunday Worship are available on BBC iPlayer and the Radio 4 Sunday morning service is on BBC Sounds.









Welcome to St Peter's Church

We are pleased that you have chosen to come in and, if you've come for a time of reflection and prayer, we hope you will find peace and a closeness to God. In the Bible in Psalm 46 God says, 'Be still and know that I am God'. So, sitting in God's presence in the quiet of this building where past generations have offered their prayers is an excellent way to pray. However, sometimes we need words to help us to articulate what we feel. So here are some prayers and bible texts that may offer some starting points for your own reflection and prayer:

Matthew 11 v 28 - 30 Jesus offers to take on our burdens

Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.

A good way to start a time of prayer

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known and from whom no secrets are hid.

Cleanse the thoughts of my heart by the inspiration of thy Holy Spirit that I may perfectly love thee and worthily magnify thy holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Keep us, good Lord,

under the shadow of your mercy in this time of uncertainty and distress. Sustain and support the anxious and fearful,

and lift up all who are brought low; that we may rejoice in your comfort knowing that nothing can separate us from your love

in Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen

A prayer for those who suffer

Merciful God, we entrust to your tender care

Those who are ill or in pain, Knowing that whenever danger threatens

Your everlasting arms are there to hold them safe.

Comfort and heal them and restore them to health and strength; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Loving God,

thank you for this house of prayer where we praise and thank you for all you have given us.
Help us to go out into the world, refreshed by your Spirit, to do what you have called us to do in Jesus Christ, our Lord. **Amen**

This week's online worship

Although St Peter's is now open for private prayer, our services continue online with 9:30 am Holy Communion and 11:00 am Matins or Holy Communion (BCP) each Sunday – today is our Patronal Festival when we celebrate St Peter from whom our Church takes its name. Although St Peter's Day is on 29th June, a Patronal Festival is allowed to be transferred to the nearest Sunday.

The reredos behind the high altar in Church has a painting of St Peter with the risen Christ on its central panel. It refers to the third time Jesus appeared to his disciples, on the seashore in Galilee. The text on the panel says, 'Lord thou knowest that I love thee', which is Peter's answer to Christ's question. Read the full story in John 21.

Morning and Evening Prayer are at 8:00 am and 5:00 pm from Monday to Saturday – please come and join us, just follow the links for all the options and instructions.

But, what if I don't have access to the internet?

You can listen to our two Sunday Services live on your phone.

To listen to the 9:30 am Holy Communion:

- 1. Dial **0131 460 1196**
- 2. When asked enter the Meeting ID 822 660 892 followed by a hash #
- 3. You will then be asked to enter your personal ID just press hash # again
- 4. When asked enter the Meeting's password 294002 followed by a hash # You should now be able to hear the service!

To listen to the 11:00 am Matins or Holy Communion (BCP):

- 5. Dial **0131 460 1196**
- 6. When asked enter the Meeting ID 636 318 496 followed by a hash #
- 7. You will then be asked to enter your personal ID just press hash # again
- 8. When asked enter the Meeting's password 216195 followed by a hash # You should now be able to hear the service!

Be aware, however, that your phone provider will charge you for this service. The best way to find out how much it costs per minute is to contact your provider and ask the cost of a call from your phone to an 0131 number on a Sunday morning.



Volunteers wanted for Cathedral's Wing and a Prayer project



Ripon Cathedral is looking for volunteers to make origami angels to create an installation of 11,000 paper angels that will fill the nave with prayers for those who have lost their lives to the Coronavirus and for those in the NHS, and other frontline services, who are risking their lives for the sake of others.

The paper and printed instructions can be delivered to volunteers' homes, and there are also YouTube videos, at various speeds, showing how to fold the paper. It takes about three minutes to make one angel. The installation is to raise funds for the Yorkshire Air Ambulance and for Ripon Cathedral. The public is encouraged to donate an angel and leave a prayer for a special person.
