Election Call

Under normal circumstances we hold our Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) at the end of April. This is an occasion where we review the past twelve months; hear reports; ask questions; and look to the months ahead. This year, however, this is postponed until **Tuesday 20**th **October at 7.00pm** – **in Church** and also via **Zoom**.

Sadly, both of our brilliant current Churchwardens, Paul Medforth and Patricia Stableford, will be standing down at this meeting, so the APCM will provide an opportunity to say thank you to them for their sterling service both before and during the current extraordinary period. Furthermore, of course, we will need to elect two new Churchwardens. I am delighted that Sian Lockwood and Sarah Martin have

This year we also have space to elect six new members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) and four Deanery Synod Representatives (who also serve on the PCC). Nomination forms and a 'PCC Tonight' booklet outlining the purpose and remit of PCCs will be available at the back of Church and also online – again, follow the *Annual Meeting* link. To stand for election as a Churchwarden, a member of the PCC, or a Deanery Synod Representative, you must have been a member of the St Peter's Electoral Roll for at least the preceding six months. The best way to find out what's really involved is to ask someone who's been there before, so do feel free to talk with any current members of the Council (listed on the *Annual Meeting* web page) or to one of the Clergy.


Licensing of Catharine Davies last Sunday

St Peter's Church was as full as the current restrictions allow for the admission and licensing of Catharine as a Licensed Lay Minister (Reader). After a welcome and prayers from the Bishop, Bob Mathews was commissioned as Assistant Warden of Readers for the Ripon Episcopal Area. Catharine then had to make a formal declaration of assent and obedience. The Epistle was read by Sarah Martin, Reader at St Peter's, and the Gospel by Stewart Davies, also a Reader and Catharine's husband. The sermon was given by Archdeacon Jonathan Gough, who then presented Catharine to the Bishop to be admitted to the office of Reader. Catharine received a Bible and her licence from the Bishop and was vested in a blue scarf by Stewart. She was congratulated with long and loud applause from everyone! The Bishop asked the congregation to uphold and encourage her in her ministry and to continue to pray for her – and with God's help we will.

Catharine writes," I want to thank people for their support – in prayers or presence - which I felt as a wave willing me on, for which I am and will continue to be so very thankful for. Whilst the official licensing is the 'rubber stamp', it is the authentic and tangible sense of being among and supported by the people of St Peter's that is the ongoing blessing in this ministry. It reminds me I am here to serve with gratitude, but one amongst many 'ministers'."
