Coffee or chocolate? Our Harvest Appeal

Today we are celebrating the work of *Christian Aid* and supporting their **Global Neighbours Appeal**, which highlights the charity's work in countries like Nicaragua where communities have joined forces to overcome the crises of poverty and injustice.

Nicaragua is the second poorest country in Latin America and one of the countries most affected by climate change. Around 80% of the population depend on agriculture for survival and growing coffee is their main source of income. Angela Zelaya is a farmer in Santa Rosa, pictured here with her two daughters. Angela's coffee farm used to provide a good living for her family, but now the changing climate in Nicaragua means her harvests are failing. Facing this crisis has brought her community together

to work as a co-operative supported by *Christian Aid*'s local partner, Soppexoca. They are helping farmers protect their livelihoods by shifting from coffee production to climate-resistant cocoa – providing the cocoa plants and the expert knowledge to grow this new crop.

This Harvest, *Christian Aid* is asking supporters to reach out to our global neighbours and help more communities overcome crisis. They want people to:

- **Give** to help communities around the world come together to overcome the crisis of poverty.
- Act by calling for the cancellation of debt repayments for low-income countries during the coronavirus crisis.
- **Pray** for our global neighbours facing crisis in all its forms.


Help needed to make Poppies for Remembrance Sunday

National Harvest Service from our Diocese



Creation and the Harvest is the focus of this week's Church of England online service, broadcast from the Diocese of Leeds and led by the Bishop of Ripon, the Rt Revd Dr Helen-Ann Hartley. Viewers will have the opportunity to join the Bishop and members of St John's Church, Sharrow, as they share readings and offer prayers for God's creation.

The service will also feature contributions from a variety of local people, including Neil Heseltine (*pictured with Bishop Helen-Ann*), chair of the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, and whose family have farmed for generations near Malham Cove. Kate Dale, a farmer in the Vale of York, shares her reflections in the middle of Harvest, along with Yorkshire painter David Stead, who talks about his work and how it relates to themes of place and belonging.

The service will be broadcast at 9:00 am this Sunday and can be found on the Church of England's <u>website</u>, <u>Facebook page</u> and <u>YouTube channel</u>.
