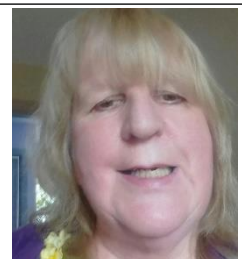

The exhibition about Amnesty International in the Glass Foyer

On 10th December 1948, the General Assembly of the United Nations adopted and proclaimed the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR). The preamble recognised the inherent dignity and inalienable rights of all members of the human family as the foundation of freedom, justice and peace in the world. It declared that 'All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights. They are endowed with reason and conscience and should act towards one another in a spirit of brotherhood.' Amnesty International's vision is of a world in which every person enjoys all the rights enshrined in the UDHR. We bring torturers to justice, change oppressive laws, and free people jailed just for voicing their opinions. Amnesty is a global movement of more than 7 million people working in over 150 countries and territories. Our local group writes

A message from the Mayor's Office about Remembrance Sunday

'On Sunday 8th November we are unable to hold the customary civic Remembrance Day service and wreath laying ceremony at the Harrogate Cenotaph. In order to adhere to the current restrictions in relation to the Covid-19 pandemic we are not permitted more than six people at the wreath laying ceremony at 11:00 am.

The Mayor along with a representative from each of the armed forces, the Royal British Legion and the Church will take part in the wreath laying, representing the citizens of the Borough of Harrogate and the relevant associations.

It is with regret that we are unable to invite organisations or individuals to join the private wreath laying service this year and ask that people remember from home. You are most welcome to visit the Cenotaph on the 8th November to pay your respects or lay a wreath, but we respectfully ask that you do not visit between 10:45 am and 11:30 am when the civic wreath laying will take place.

We are keen to ensure that the day is marked in a safe, respectful and appropriate way. Please accept our sincere apologies for the changes to the customary format.



At St Peter's we will be exploring the theme of Remembrance in both our morning services on that Sunday, but without the usual participation by uniformed organisations and civic representatives. 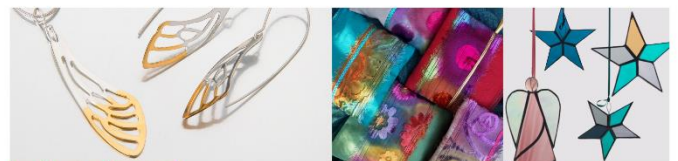
