A vision that informs action

What is the vision of St Peter's Church? If a friend or neighbour asked this question, how would you answer? It is notoriously difficult to communicate a vision that is short enough to be memorable and detailed enough to be meaningful. That is why, over the past two months, we've been working on a vision statement that is more detailed than just 'feeding hungry people' and simpler than the full statement on our website.

Our vision:

Feeding hungry people around God's open, generous table

Jesus' ministry was full of invitation and grace. He removed barriers and created connections between people and with God.

Our vision is to build community as Jesus did as we gather around his table.

How do you respond to this statement? Does it say things that feel true for you as a member of St Peter's? Does it describe a future of which you would like to be a part? Is it faithful to what it means to be a Christian church at the centre of our town? It would be very helpful to know your answers to these questions.

The point of having a vision is to guide action — including the way we use our building. As we prepare for major roof repairs, the Parochial Church Council are launching a consultation alongside the development of this vision. Alongside repairing the roof, what other small or large changes could we make to our building to enable the better fulfilment of our vision? 
Shaeron Caton Rose is raising money for SHINE, West Bowling

Last chance to see 16 Days of Activism Against Gender Violence Exhibition


