The final words from Romans 8 v 9 - 25 remind us: 'But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.'

As summer approaches, many of us eagerly anticipate the holidays. But what is it that we truly look forward to? Is it the holiday itself, or the joy and relaxation it promises? Similarly, in life, we often yearn for new experiences—a new car, a new job, or perhaps a remodelled kitchen. But again, I ask: is it the 'thing' we desire, or the happiness we believe it will bring?

We all carry a deep longing for happiness, but what truly makes us happy? How enduring are the shortterm pleasures we seek? 


