Supporting seafarers affected by the war in Ukraine

The Mission to Seafarers, a mission society of the Anglican Communion, is open night and day, 365 days a year. They work in 200 ports across 50 countries, caring for seafarers of all ranks, nationalities and beliefs.



After two years of dealing with the pandemic and its overwhelming impact on seafarers and their families, there were hopeful signs – then the Ukraine war hit.

With 15% of the maritime workforce being either Ukrainian or Russian, once again shipping – and the people at its heart – have been very badly impacted. Ukrainian crew face acute anxiety about family back home. There has been immense difficulty for Ukrainian seafarers wishing to return, or even just to get money back home. Russian seafarers have also been very badly hit by a conflict not of their making. More widely, there are also seafarers of other nationalities who have found themselves trapped in Ukrainian ports and some vessels have come under Russian missile attack.

In response, the Mission have been offering vital pastoral support, as well as providing access to free communication at a time when connecting with families is even more vital than usual. They have produced additional 'own language' Russian and Ukrainian resources and set aside a substantial fund to support individual families in Ukraine.

Whether stranded at home or on a ship, whether in need of practical support or simply a listening ear, the Mission is there for those who are caught up in the conflict.

St Swithun's Day if Thou Dost Rain...

On Friday it is 15th July – St Swithun's Day. Legend has it that if it rains on St Swithun's Day then the wet weather will continue for 40 days:

St. Swithun's day if thou dost rain,

For forty days it will remain,

St. Swithun's day if thou be fair,

For forty days 'twill rain nae mair.

St Swithun was the Bishop of Winchester in Saxon times. His dying wish was that he be buried in a simple grave outside by the door of the Saxon Minster and here he rested for over a hundred years; but in 971 the monks of Winchester decided to move his body to a more opulent shrine inside the



Nothing remains of St Swithun's shrine in Winchester Cathedral today, but this modern memorial now marks the spot.

Cathedral. The ceremony, on 15th July, was ruined by a huge downpour and so the legend started. His tomb became a major site for pilgrims hoping to be healed until the Reformation when it was destroyed. Let's hope Friday stays dry and fair!




The English Cathedral photography exhibition
