

How we can reduce our energy emissions from transport

Harrogate Climate Change Coalition has recently published advice on how we can reduce our carbon emissions from transport – see <u>https://www.hdccc.info/reducing-emissions-at-home</u>. Working from home, walking, cycling, using public transport, eco-driving and car-sharing are key ways to reduce your transport-related emissions. For those who have to drive to work, switching to a lower carbon vehicle, such as a plug-in hybrid or fully electric car should reduce your fuel costs and your carbon footprint. When considering a lower carbon vehicle, do consider full lifetime costs. Low carbon vehicles are generally more expensive to buy than petrol or diesel alternatives. If you are considering leasing your vehicle, they may be more cost-effective than conventional cars. Note that from 2030 it will no longer be possible to buy new petrol or diesel cars in the UK. For long journeys consider using the train rather than the car. Minimise your journeys made by flying.



Lifeline Harrogate is a local charity providing supported housing to people moving on from the Harrogate Homeless Project, rehab, prison and Harrogate sometimes straight off the streets. People become

homeless for a variety of reasons and many never expect to be in this position.

We are continually inspired by the scripture in the book of Isaiah which says:

My people will live in peaceful dwelling places, in secure homes, in undisturbed *places of rest* - this is our guiding principle.

We have five houses in the Harrogate area with three bedrooms in each so we can look after fifteen residents at any one time. Each resident has their own room key an important first step to independent living. They really appreciate this. We provide them with all the help they need to get back on their feet – a place they can call home; some training and education; we help them register for a doctor, get a bank account and provide simple home comforts.


