## **Confirmation 2023**

A Confirmation is a very special service where candidates who want to publicly commit to the Christian faith, declare their intention to follow the teachings of Jesus Christ, receive the Holy Spirit and join in the fellowship of the church family.



There are four candidates this year: Diane Harrison, Mark Antony Harrison, Jordan James Martell and Roy Douglas Taylor. Diane, Mark and Jordan regularly attend our Stepping Stones service, and I had the privilege of leading them through the Start Course as we explored the Christian faith together. Roy is a well-established member of the St Peter's family, he serves on the PCC and is a member of the Pastoral Care Team, and in the past he has assisted with both the Alpha and Start courses.

This year we have the great privilege of welcoming The Rt Revd John Pritchard to confirm our candidates. John Pritchard is the former Bishop of Oxford and a renowned author of several books about the Christian faith.

The Confirmation service will be starting at 7:30 pm on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> June. I strongly encourage you to support our candidates by praying for them and attending the service - all are welcome.


#### Come for lunch next Sunday

#### Barnabas the Apostle commemorated on 11<sup>th</sup> June

Barnabas, though not one of the Twelve Apostles, was one of the very earliest followers of Jesus and a leader of the early church. The first mention of him in the Bible (Acts 4 v 36) says he was 'Joseph, a Levite from Cyprus, whom the apostles called Barnabas (which means *son of encouragement*)'.

His new name fits what we know of his actions. When Saul (later Paul) came to Jerusalem after his conversion, most of the Christians there wanted nothing to do with him. They had known him as a persecutor and an enemy of the Church. But Barnabas was willing to give him a second chance - he spoke to Paul, vouched for him and brought him to meet the other Christians. Later, Paul, Barnabas and his cousin, Mark, went on a missionary journey to Antioch, but Mark turned back and went home. When Paul and Barnabas were about to set out on another journey, Barnabas wanted to take Mark again, but Paul refused, saying that Mark had shown himself to be undependable. Barnabas wanted to give Mark a second chance, and so he and Mark went off to Cyprus, while Paul went to Syria with Silas. Apparently Mark responded well to the trust given by the 'son of encouragement', since we find that Paul later speaks of him as a valuable assistant (2 Timothy 4 v 11).
