Welcome to two St Hild's students training for ordination



People who want to train for ordination to the priesthood go through a selection process called the Shared Discernment Process. This usually involves initial conversations at a local level with their parish clergy or chaplain, followed by engagement with their Diocese and finally with the Bishop and his or her advisers.

If the person is recommended for ordination training, then they become ordinands and begin studying at a theological college. There are many different training pathways: full-time residential courses; context based courses, which involve a mixture of classes and learning by doing; or studying whilst working, which are part-time. They all involve placements, sometimes in a different area

of ministry, or away from their home-parish or in an international context. In January two students from St Hild's College will be coming to St Peter's Church on placement. Anna Boyce is a third year ordinand at St Hild's and is training part-time. She is married to Martin and has a grown up son. As well as working in Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS), Anna is a Lay Chaplain at Holy Rood House, a retreat house in Thirsk, one day a week. In her spare time she likes walking in the Dales.

Sam Clayton is in her second year at St Hild's and is also training part-time. Many of you will know her already as she often leads the Intercessions at our Family Communion Service and she also preaches at the Stepping Stones Service. She is married to Chris, our Associate Vicar, and they have two sons – Alexander and Daniel. During her placement she will be focusing on traditional styles of worship at our 8:30 am Holy Communion, Choral Matins and Choral Evensong, which all follow the Book Of Common Prayer. She is excited about the upcoming focussed training with John Longstaff, 'How to Lead Matins Well'.

Anna and Sam will be on placement at St Peter's from January to early April 2025.

Today is Plough Sunday!

Since medieval times the start of the agricultural year was marked by bringing a ploughshare (or a milk churn or even a lamb) into the local church for a blessing; often there was Morris dancing and a procession. Plough Sunday is traditionally celebrated after the twelve days of Christmas, on the first Sunday



after Epiphany – this year that's 12th January. Although the nature of farming has changed over the centuries, Plough Sunday is still seen as a way of celebrating the work of farmers, to bless the ploughs and prepare the land for sowing.

Ripon Cathedral's Plough Sunday Service, supported by the Yorkshire Agricultural Society, takes place this afternoon at 3:30pm. Come at 2:30 pm to enjoy the Highside Longsword Dancers perform and hot pork rolls will be served.


