So grateful to God for getting me this far



Ordained people are 'set apart', wearing strange clothes and calling ourselves 'Reverend'; it is not surprising that people can believe that we are not quite ... human! However, a very 'human' year threatened my curacy. In October, my eighteen-year-old son was diagnosed with Wilson's Disease. It gobbled up Tom's motor-skills, his ability to swallow and walk - and worst of all, his speech. He is improving slowly but is still disabled. After prayer and consideration with family and Alan, we all decided to persevere, and concessions are being made to enable me to give Tom the care he needs for his recovery. Our aims are to get him back to Durham University in 2024 and to gradually increase my reach into church life.

So, I am *thrilled* to be with you all! I love meeting long-established and new people, learning from the many layers of experience and practice that make up St Peter's and its setting. It is taking me longer to get to all the services and groups than I would like but I am on my way! I am so grateful to God for getting me this far and to be able to begin to serve God with you. Do look out for my husband Graham and our twins Phoebe and Tom, whose attendance is affected by Wilson's Disease. I look forward to hearing *your* stories which hold golden threads of God's love. This love is present in all our human frailties and joys.

The Cenotaph Centenary: *More than a Name on a Memorial*

This year marks the centenary of Harrogate's war memorial, which was unveiled on 1st September 1923. It records the names of the 1,163 local people who died in the two World Wars. To mark this anniversary an exhibition '**More than a Name on a Memorial**' held at West Park URC will tell each of their stories. Would you like to go to Peru to help finish the Artizan Café in Arequipa?

Last Sunday Susie Hart, the Director of *Artizan International*, told us she had recently returned from Peru, where she had been leading a volunteer team who had visited the Artizan centre there that provides training and employment for people with disabilities who would otherwise be living in poverty. Their main objective was to work alongside six local deaf people to make a series of large-scale mosaics to decorate the walls and the counter area of the café that they plan to open there in November. 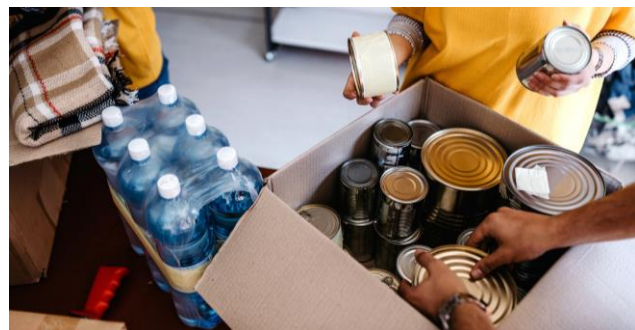
