Sanctuary welcomes Year Sixes


St Peter's Youth Group

Chris Clayton's future at St Peter's



As Alan Garrow announced at our AGM, Chris Clayton's Curacy would, under normal circumstances, now be drawing to a close. Thankfully, however, a combination of factors allows the option for Chris to stay on for up to four more years. First, we have the promise of a gift of £150,000 to help cover the cost of an extra full-time stipendiary priest - Curates in training come at no financial cost to the training parish, once Chris becomes Associate Vicar, however, this will no longer be the case. Second, the Bishop of Ripon

has agreed to the appointment – she will formally license him at a service in St Peter's in June 2022. Third, Chris and Sam are willing to stay! This is, of course, absolutely excellent news. Alan says Chris has been an exceptional colleague and we all look forward to his developing ministry among us.

UK Churches' Relay to COP26 crosses our Diocese this Summer

The UK Churches' Relay to COP26 is organised by the Young Christian Climate Network (YCCN). The Relay sets off from Cornwall today, where the G7 summit is being held right now; there the seven members (UK, USA, Canada, Japan, Germany, France and Italy) are meeting to discuss the fight against Coronavirus and how to build back better for a fairer and greener future for all. It finishes in Glasgow in time for the start of COP26 UN Climate Change Conference on 1st November.




The Relay comes up through our Diocese from the Huddersfield area to the Ripon area, stopping at Leeds and York on the way in September. The YCCN is looking to use the walk to argue for more climate justice and creation care, while pushing for systematic change on a global and a local scale. The Relay aims to raise awareness of COP26 and a Christian imperative to engage in creation care theology, individually and corporately.
