Harrogate School of Theology & Mission

Do you remember the amazing 'Threads through Revelation' exhibition at Ripon Cathedral? It was the work of textile artist Jacqui Wilson. The twelve huge textile panels retelling the Genesis story in the first pages of the Bible will be exhibited at Ripon Cathedral from 19th October until 20th November.
