Come and help to make Christingles




Lent Course at St Peter's 2026

Gaudete Sunday - Rejoice in the Lord always!



The Advent Wreath in St Peter's Church has a white candle in the centre surrounded by four candles; three are purple, the liturgical colour for Advent, and one is rose pink - it will be lit today. In medieval times, Advent was observed as a fast of forty days before Christmas. This

'Refreshment Sunday' was a welcome splash of colour in the restrained atmosphere of Advent, a break in the fast. The readings and liturgy for today speak of joy; we are urged to: *Gaudete in Domino simper* - Rejoice in the Lord always. So, today became known as Gaudete or Rose Sunday.
