

Handel's Messiah at St. Peter's: Friday 20th December at 7:15 pm

Behold, a virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call his name Emmanuel, GOD WITH US. (Isaiah 7 v 14; Matthew 1 v 23)

The words in upper case are not printed thus in the King James Bible, used by Charles Jennens, the compiler of the libretto of *Messiah*. But they are so printed in the published book of words to the oratorio, made available to the paying audiences in Handel's time. These three words encapsulate what this magnificent work is about: it is a meditation on 'the mystery of Godliness', obliquely telling the Jesus' birth. death storv of and resurrection, but mentioning him by name only once (in a chorus which is often omitted, though we are including it). Handel himself never performed Messiah at Christmas, but as we celebrate the birth of Jesus we can use this wonderful selection of scripture to reflect once again on this unique manifestation of God here on earth among us.



St Peter's choir is joined for the first time by the choir of St. Wilfrid's church along with their Director of Music, Anthony Gray, who will be playing the organ. A number of friends constitute the Harrogate Voices; the soloists are Jenny Stafford, Elisabeth Paul, Toby Ward and Andrew Greenan. The Harrogate Handel players will as usual be led by Fiona Love. 

Gaudete Sunday – Rejoice in the Lord always!



The Advent Wreath in St Peter's Church has a white candle in the centre surrounded by four candles; three are purple, the liturgical colour for Advent, and one is rose pink - it will be lit today. In medieval times, Advent was observed as a fast of forty days before Christmas. This 'Refreshment Sunday' was a

welcome splash of colour in the restrained atmosphere of Advent; a break in the fast. The readings and liturgy for today speak of joy; we are urged to: *Gaudete in Domino simper* - Rejoice in the Lord always. So, today became known as Gaudete or Rose Sunday.


Being With: an online course exploring Christian faith and life
