# A Church for Everyone?

St Peter's people work hard to make sure that everyone who comes into this Church is welcomed and included.

Visitors to St Peter's often comment on how warm and hospitable we are and most of our congregation say that they value their acceptance and sense of belonging.



However, we know that we can do a **lot** better. There are barriers that stop some people from feeling as welcome as we would want. We know about some of these obstacles and have tried to address them (e g large print service sheets, ramps and accessible toilets), but we know we haven't done enough. Other barriers are hidden from us, and we need to understand and deal with them to make sure that our Church is for everyone. Our PCC wants St Peter's to understand and address the blocks that stop some people from feeling welcome in our Church.

As a first step we joined the *Inclusive Church Network*. This is a network of churches that share the same vision – of an inclusive church which celebrates and affirms every person and does not discriminate.

Our next step will be taken on **Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> January 2023,** from **10:00 am to 2:15 pm** in Church, when members of the PCC and our wider congregation will come together to think about how to make our Church welcoming for everyone – and take action. 

# This week's worship online



### The Yorkshire Speak Their Name Suicide Memorial Quilt



Karen Sykes, Anna Scott and Pat Sowa understand what it means to be mothers bereaved by suicide and have worked together on a powerful project that is helping others who have suffered similar losses to find solace and support.

They organised the creation of the Yorkshire *Speak Their Name* Suicide Memorial Quilt that has been made by people bereaved by suicide with a Yorkshire connection. There are four panels each one with 48 squares. Every square has been made with love and dedicated to someone much missed and lost to suicide. The quilt is currently on a tour of Yorkshire and at the moment is at Ripon Cathedral from 28<sup>th</sup> December to 30<sup>th</sup> January.


