## Thirty years of Fairtrade

Thirty years ago this month the fairtrade logo appeared on a bar of chocolate for the first time. Since then many more accredited products, produced in 58 countries, have appeared on supermarket shelves. But what difference does fairtrade really make?

Farmers are often forced to sell their crop for less than it cost to grow. But fairtrade guarantees a minimum price so that farmers aren't plunged into poverty simply because the global price has dropped. Isn't it astonishing that most farmers don't have this security?

Fairtrade farmers' cooperatives are paid a Fairtrade Premium on top of the price for the crop, which they spend on a community benefit. Things we take for granted such as schools, medical facilities, housing and clean water have been funded this way and have really transformed the lives of communities.

It also means help and training with the enormous threat of climate change. Farmers around the world are seeing a devastating effect on crop yields, so fairtrade supports them to farm in ways that mitigate the effects of a warming world. This means they can keep farming and produce the foods we rely on.

This Fairtrade Fortnight take a positive step for a more equal and sustainable world, one in which people come before profit. Simply buy a fairtrade product.

## Update on the repairs to the West Wall

We are pleased to report that the external investigation and repairs have now been completed with new lead flashing fitted where needed and the coping stones repointed. The remainder of the internal scaffolding will be installed on Monday and Tuesday, ready for the masonry contractor to start work on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> September. Therefore, the Healing Service on Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> and Holy Communion on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> will be relocated to the Music Room. When all areas of loose mortar have been removed, the wall will be left to dry out for a period of 12 months before any new plaster is applied.
