The Bereavement Journey – a course starting in September

The Bereavement Journey is for anyone who has been bereaved at any time but would value time and safe space to process their grief. It is a series of films and discussion groups that gently guide participants through the most common aspects of grief and bereavement, enabling them to process the implications for themselves and think about the next steps.



We will be running the course here at St Peter's on Monday evenings from 4th September – 16th October (6:30 – 9:00 pm) in the Brostoff Hall. There will also be a daytime course on Wednesday afternoons from 13th September – 25th October (12:30 – 3:00 pm) at St Mark's Church.

Topics include:

- *Attachment, separation and loss*
- *The pain and responses of grief*
- *Anger and guilt*
- *Coping with others' reactions*
- *Delayed and suppressed grief*
- *Adjusting to change*
- *Moving forward healthily*

Our mini Supermarket is on Thursdays 4:30 – 4:50 pm.

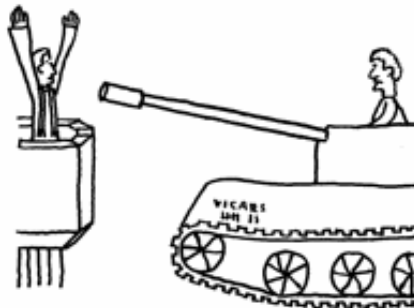

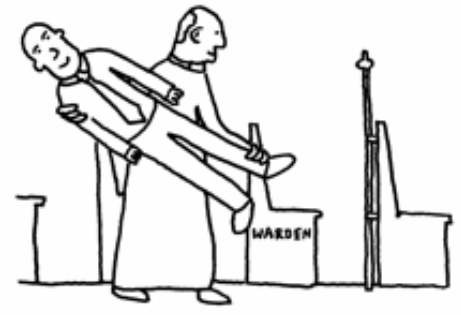

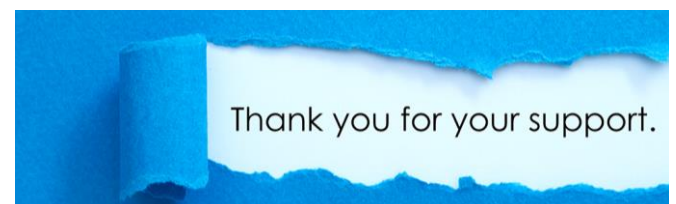
