
Now is the time for elections

Our Annual Meeting is on Tuesday 25th May at 7:00 pm. Once again, we gather online and in person to: review the (unusually short) period since our last Annual Meeting; (re)elect our Churchwardens; elect Deanery Synod Representatives and Parish Church Council (PCC) members; receive reports; ask questions; and look to the future. A 'PCC Tonight' booklet outlining the purpose and remit of PCCs is also available on the <u>Annual Meeting page of the website</u>.

A further insight into the work of our PCC may be gained through reviewing the minutes of past meetings also posted on that web page. To stand for election as a Churchwarden, Deanery Synod Representative or a member of the PCC you must have been a member of the St Peter's Electoral Roll for at least the preceding six months. Notice of nominations prior to the meeting is not legally required - however, because an online election may be necessary, advance notice would be much appreciated.

I am enormously grateful for our Churchwardens, Sarah Martin and Sian Lockwood, and all who serve on our Parochial Church Council and Deanery Synod. As we venture into new territory, yet again, it is vital to be able to draw on the wisdom and experience of others in the process of seeking to discern God's call for our next steps.


Day Four of Thy Kingdom Come - Youth Reflections 2021


Thy Kingdom Come (TKC) have teamed up with the Archbishop of York's Youth Trust to produce 11 video youth reflections, based on the daily themes of TKC, from young influential Christians across different spheres of influence. Today's theme is **Sorry** and in her video musician Elle Limebear, who has just released her debut album, reflects on when she has upset someone or has disappointed God, she feels like she has let people down. Elle sees pride as something that gets in the way of her saying sorry to other people, or to God. We need to say sorry when we're in the wrong – breakthrough and freedom comes when we say sorry.

Alongside each video there is a discussion plan – designed to explore the topic in greater depth - suitable for use in schools, colleges, youth groups and at home. Visit thykingdomcome.global/youth or watch Elle's video on Instagram or YouTube.


